

EDITOR'S SAY

For those of you that have ever wondered 'where do they get those rules from?', well there from the CAMS Manual Of Motorsport (no we don't make them up) and it is updated each year. So, if your really serious, to be sure you have the latest information you need to obtain a copy each year (\$32.00 + \$5.00 P&H). For those who don't have a manual, reproduced elsewhere, is a couple of the most quoted rules and regulations used for rallies and club events;- Schedules A and R.

In case you haven't heard, Speedy (Shane Ogilvie) had an oops and over at Dry park recently. The car has been repaired but the doctors say he was lucky to get out of it without a more serious injury. A damaged neck vertebrae and no driving for some time! Get well soon Speedy.

First aid kits. Following on from the talk by Peter Nilson at the last club meeting about first aid, anyone wishing to buy or upgrade/update their first aid kits can call me and a bulk order can be placed to take advantage of discounted prices. Kits available that meet CAMS requirements range from \$30 to \$50 depending on what you want and know how to use. A kit recommended by Peter is around \$40

FROM THE MANUAL

Schedule A (page 11-44)

ALL AUTOMOBILES SHALL, OF NECESSITY IN ALL COMPRTITIONS:

- 1. Comply with the definition of an automobile.
- 2. Be fitted with some form of protection between engine and driver's compartment suitable and sufficient in the case of a fire for preventing the passage of flame.
- 3. Be so constructed that the driver is protected from the entry of foreign matter into the driving compartment from the road or road wheels.
- 4. Be equipped with a transmission system so arranged that the propeller shaft and universal or cardan joints, if passing through or beneath the passenger compartment, shall be under the floorboards, or fitted in tubes or casings. Such floorboards, tubes or casings shall not be of a temporary nature, but shall be joined together and firmly fixed to the coachwork or chassis. Any chains used in the transmission of power or driving any auxiliary component shall be effectively guarded.
- 5. Be fitted so that all fuel tanks are vented externally to the bodywork.
- 6. If not registered for use on public roads, have any steering column locking device removed.
- 7. If required to be fitted with roll-over protection by the provision of these rules, be equipped with such protection only in accordance with provisions in Schedule J.
- 8. Unless specifically otherwise approved, use only Commercial Fuel, as defined.
- 9. Be fitted with windows (including windscreens) which, for other than glass, are clear, transparent and free from colouring; glass windows must not be coloured or tinted after production.
- 10. Have displayed on the dashboard a valid CAMS registration label for the relevant competition.
- 11. Be fitted with safety harness or seat belts as prescribed in Schedule I.

Schedule R (page 11-45)

In addition to the following requirements, al vehicles must conform to Schedule A.

- 1. All vehicles must be registered for use on public roads with an appropriate government authority, and must be covered by a policy of third party insurance. The engine and chassis numbers must agree with those shown on the certificate of registration.
- 2. Signs and advertising are permitted on vehicles unless specifically prohibited in Supplementary Regulations. The requirements of NCR 155 and Schedule K must be observed.
- 3. Vehicles must not display competition numbers other that those specified and provided by the event organisers. Such numbers must be removed or covered immediately the event has concluded; this does not apply to cars which are displayed in showrooms or other trade promotions held away from public roads.

4. All lamps must comply with the government regulations for the State or Territory in which the sections concerned are held. Existing lamps may be removed or replaced by other units provided their position remains unchanged. The maximum number of forward facing headlamps, including fog lamps, for each State or Territory is:

Queensland: six

Northern Territory: (i) cars with two headlamps fitted as standard: four

(ii) cars with four headlamps fitted as standard: six

Western Australia: six

New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory:

(i) cars with two headlamps fitted as standard: six (ii) cars with four headlamps fitted as standard: eight

Tasmania: no limit on the number of forward facing lamps (minimum two headlamps)

Victoria: six South Australia: six

Forward facing lamps must be rigidly mounted in pairs and be equidistant from the ground and from the centre line of the car except in Western Australia, Queensland, New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory where a single lamp is permitted in the centre of the front.

The centres of additional forward facing lamps must be:

- (i) below the horizontal plane of the lowest point of the windscreen
- (ii) no closer to the ground that 600 mm
- (iii) no further from the ground than 1350mm, and
- (iv) at least 600mm apart, except in the case of a second pair in New South Wales, the Australian Capital Territory, Victoria and South Australia.

All forward facing headlamps, except the outer pair on low beam, must extinguish when the headlamps are dipped. Up to two revercing lamps are permitted provided they are not more than 1m above the ground. If these are actuated manually, a warning lamp, energised together with the lamps, must be fitted within the sight of the driver. Any guards fitted to the headlamps must permit manual cleaning of the lens.

- 5. Additional fuel tanks of free but safe design may be fitted outside the passenger compartment and must be vented to the outside of the vehicle. If the design of the car makes fitment outside the passenger compartment impractible, eg, Ford Laser, it is permitted to fit the tank in that compartment provided that the filling orifice and ventilation are outside that compartment regardless of vehicle construction (see also specific Group Regulations). On cars in witch the fuel tank is either fitted as standard, or has been relocated, in the passenger compartment (ie, the rear of a hatch back) and/or has been relocated in the luggage compartment of any type of body-work configuration car.
 - (i) the fuel filler must be constructed so that any fuel spilled may drain safely to the outside of the vehicle
 - (ii) if the filling orifice is located within the body-work, it must be fitted with a catch tray to the satisfaction of the scrutineers
 - (iii) a flame and liquid proof bulkhead, which may be of transparent material and which effectively separates the compartment occupied by the crew members from any component of the fuel tank or refuelling system must be fitted. Additional fuel containers which are not part of the piped fuel system must not be carried in the passenger compartment regardless of vehicle construction. If carried, they must be securely fastened to the vehicle structure.
 - (iv) In additional to Schedule G, the specification of fuel as approved by the FIA for the current year's World Rally Championship competition will be permitted for use in Australian rallies.
- 6. All cars must be fitted with at least a lap/sash safety harness for all crew members and passengers carried during the event. Each harness must comply with AS E35 or a FIA or CAMS approved equivalent standard.
- 7. An effective exhaust muffler must be fitted at all times. The maximum noise emission permissible is 96dba(A) as tested by CAMS method.
- 8. At least two reflective or fluorescent red triangles of metal or plastic material (sides at least 350mm in length) must be carried, and must be displayed in cases where a stationary car could be a hazard to other road users (eg, breakdown).
- 9. The use of studded or spiked tyres is prohibited. All tyres must be treaded in the original manufacturing process to a minimum depth of 2mm. Tyres used must not be expressly designed for motor racing. The onus is at all times on individual competitors to demonstrate compliance with these requirements. Mud flaps of stout material must be fitted behind all driving wheels, and in the case of front wheel drive vehicles, behind all four wheels. They must be no closer than 50mm to, and no further than 100mm from, the ground, must mask the full width of the tyre when viewed from behind, and within 300mm of the tyre. Mud flaps fitted behind wheels must leave unmasked at least one third of the

width of the car. Those fitted in front of rear wheels must leave at least 20cm unmasked. The vehicle must comply with these requirements when it is presented in "ready to start" condition.

10. All cars must be fitted with one or two fire extinguishers, which must meet the following criteria;

The extinguishant must be:

BCF (not permitted by civil legislation)

NAF S3 NAF P AFFF

Dry Powder

or as otherwise permitted by the FIA

The minimum capacity of the total of the two extinguishers must not be less than:

Each AFFF extinguisher must be equipped with a means of checking the pressure of the contents The following information must be visible on each extinguisher:

- capacity
- type of extinguisher
- weight or volume of the extinguisher
- date of which the extinguisher must next be checked, which must be no more than two years after the date of the last filling or the date of the last check

Cars fitted with plumbed-in systems must also be equipped with hand held extinguishers, as above

11. APPERANCE

General appearance and presentation of vehicles must be of a neat and well finished standard.

12. RECOMMENDED EQUIPMENT

The following equipment is ted monorided for all cars

- towing and desinching gear. Towing eyes should be fitted at convenient locations front and rear (i)
- (ii) fitment of laminated windscreen

13. SPECIAL REQUIRENMENTS FOR AUSTRALIAN CHAMPIONSHIP, INTERNATIONAL AND SPECIAL STAGE RALLIES

- An adequate fire wall to separate the fuel tank from the habitacle which is impervious to the passage of (i) fumes or liquid, must be fitted to all cars which are fitted with other than their standard fuel tank systems.
- A roll bar or cage complying with the provisions of Schedule J save that a cross bar is not required. Suitable (ii) padding must be fitted to roll bars so as to minimise injury to crew members. For International Championship events the FIA roll over protection regulations apply.
- All vehicle are required to carry on board a weatherproof emergency first aid kit containing at least the (iii) following:
- 2 x extra large universal accident dressing
- 1 x roll adhesive tape 6 x safety pins
- 2 x medium combination pads

- 2 x large open weave bandages
- 1 x large burn dressing with a non-adhesive surface
- 6 x adhesive plaster strips

- 2 x medium open weave bandages
- 1 x thermo accident blanket
- 1 x triangular bandages 2 x sterile eye pads

- 1 x pair dressing scissors
- 1 x aluminium foil dressing
- 1 x first aid manual

NOTES:

- These items may be purchased from St John Ambulance as a kit or from any reputable first aid supply company
- This kit is no substitute for first aid training. It is recommended that all competitors should undertake a first aid course.

CLUB MEETINGS

If you look back through the minutes of club meetings, you will find the same names in attendance throughout. The meetings are advertised in the club magazine which now comes out once a month. Meetings usually only take a couple of hours and are closed by 9.30pm. Decisions are being made by the same handful of members and these decisions affect all of us. If you don't like these decisions when they are put into practice then you should come to the meetings and have your say. Don't just show up at an event and do nothing else to help make the club successful.

At the last meeting (15 JUNE), we had a guest speaker, Peter Nilson, a paramedic with the Queensland Ambulance Service (Q.A.S). Peter spoke about the do's and don'ts in case of an accident, not just for rallying but road accidents in general. The same rules apply to both. We (Peter and I) spoke of First Aid Kits and prices of various types available, also discussed was the importance of the VIAL OF LIFE. These are just film canisters with a personal history sheet within. This sheet provides important information which can be used by Paramedics, Doctors and yourself if you have to give aid to an injured person. It is suggested that each rally car contains (2) vials. One for the driver and one for the navigator and they can be obtained at each rally and spares will also be available in case you change navigators. They can be taped to the lower forward facing surface of the front leg of the roll cage. This position is not in the way of the cars occupant and is easily accessible if needed. They are optional but the info supplied by these can save YOUR life, think about it. Thanks to Peter Nilson for finding time in his busy schedule to attend our meeting.

CLUB PROPERTY

With the Q.R.C just around the corner, preparations are moving a little faster. The gathering of control boards, arrows and cautions has proved to be quite a challenge. These boards seem to be scattered all over Townsville and not in one place like they should be. Ron and I have delegated ourselves Limited Property Officers, this meaning we are willing to look after and maintain this signage. Once we have gathered all the boards, we will clean, repair and repaint them and manufacture new ones. They will also be counted, grouped and logged. Anyone wanting signs for an event, can obtain them from us and return them to us on the day or within the next week, not weeks later. It will be the directors responsibility to return them to us, so we don't have to chase them. Each time any boards are taken, they will have to be signed for so we know who was the last to use them. Ron has made new stencils for the control boards, and I am hand painting arrows and cautions. This is all very time consuming work and if a price could be put on the work being carried out on this project, the club would go broke. So don't just chuck them around and abuse them, try to handle them carefully and look after them, they are a club asset and they belong to all of us.

REMINDER; we are only looking after the signage and we ask that any wire, string, rope and stakes be removed before returning them. If these boards are not returned by the specified time, the next event could suffer because of it. and it could be yours. Club property does not get the respect it truly deserves.


