Sorry guys I just had to put the photos in the newsletter, it's one of those things I just couldn't resist.



04.090	Discussion was held on the Hella Sponsorship for QRC 2004. There are still some prizes owing from 2003 and Errol Bailey has agreed to follow this up.
04.091	Stephen Berry is to approach the Federal Government regarding reducing the cost of Restricted Registration and CTP for rally cars.
04.094	Names on car windows Discussion was held on this point after some problems at Rally Queensland and it was envisaged by the Panel that next year's State Regulations would mirror ARC Regulations.
04.096	Rally Queensland The low numbers of QRC competitors at Rally Queensland was discussed. Even being two rounds of the QRC only 11 QRC competitors and 5 ARC/QRC competitors entered. Cost is an obvious consideration. But for Queensland's premier rally there should be more local competitors. The Panel will have ongoing discussions with Errol to try to find a solution.
