Ferrari sack pit crew

Modena, Italy

The Ferrari Formula 1 Team fired their entire Pit Crew vesterday.

TECHNICAL BULLETIN APPAREL

AUSTRALIAN RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP & TARMAC RALLIES

REFERENCE:

2007 CAMS Manual of Motor Sport, Section 6, Schedule D – Apparel, Article 3(c)(ii), Australian Rally Championship & Tarmac Rally Events.

RATIONALE:

To temporarily broaden the acceptable standards to allow more time for the adoption of new apparel requirements for the Australian Rally Championship and Tarmac Rally Events.

AUTHORITY:

This amendment was approved by the Australian Rally Commission via email vote on 1st March 2007.

ACTION:

Amend Article 3(c)(ii)as follows:

"(ii) Australian Rally Championship & Tarmac Rally Events:

In addition to (i) above, during all special stages, crew members are required to wear socks and boots complying with the FIA 8856-2000 or FIA 1986 standard.

From 1 January 2008, only socks and boots complying with the FIA 8856-2000 standard will be permitted."




