

To authorise the Organiser of a competition to implement appropriate Occupational Health and Safety actions by preventing the use of non-compliant apparel for the duration of that Meeting.

This amendment was approved by the Board of CAMS, Minute C04886 of the 182th Meeting, held on 15 June 2007.

ACTION:

Amend MCR 141 by the addition of the following words

141. SAFETY EQUIPMENT - APPAREL

Each occupant of an automobile must comply with the requirements of apparel for that competition. Any non-compliant apparel may be impounded by the Organiser for the duration of that Meeting.

Club Motorsport Competitors Sprint to Bathurst in December

Sydney, NSW September 21, 2007 ---

CAMS (the national sporting authority for motorsport in Australia) has today confirmed that the full Mount Panorama circuit at Bathurst will play host in December to club motorsport competitors wishing to test themselves and their cars on Australia's most revered racing circuit.

Bathurst has previously only been open twice a year to race events like the V8 Supercar Series, but Sydney based promoter TRACKCORP has been granted special access and is holding a five day event that promises to be a true driving challenge.

TRACKCORP CEO David Jellins said that they have put together a package that is built around maximum track time in a format similar to a car club sprint and expects the event to become a hallmark fixture on the Australian club motorsport calendar.

"DRIVE BATHURST 2007 is designed to give experienced club competitors the opportunity to receive expert instruction from well known and respected race champions and then drive on the full Mount Panorama Circuit, in a format familiar to club level competitors," said Jellins.

The event will have two categories: **Drive Bathurst**, a 2 day non-competitive event and **Sprint Bathurst**, a 3 day timed competition. The inaugural event will be held from 12-16 December 2007 and eligible competitors may enter either or both categories. Entry is by invitation only and is limited to just 96 participants in each category.

Special guest over the five days will be motor racing legend, Jim Richards. An inductee into the Australian Motorsport Hall of Fame, Jim has seven Bathurst race victories to his name.

Mount Panorama has long been considered the spiritual home of Australian motorsport and is one of the pre-eminent circuits in the world. There is no doubt that 'The Mountain' holds a special mystique for all motorsport enthusiasts, and **DRIVE BATHURST 2007** looks set to appeal to a wide audience who will relish the opportunity to compete at this iconic venue. Over 70% of available places have already been pre-sold.

The benefits to motorsport generally in making this spectacular circuit accessible to a greater range of participants are numerous, and the local economy will receive a substantial boost, said Jellins.

CAMS moving to simplify processes

CAMS Media Release 4 Oct 2007

CAMS has today announced that it is taking proactive measures to simplify its internal processes and enhance its customer service and responsiveness. This comes on the back of the recent Corporate Planning Workshop which identified the need for CAMS to deliver a new revitalised product and service to its members and the community.

The first initiative being undertaken involves the centralisation of Event Permits and Vehicle Log Book administration to CAMS' Melbourne office. This work precedes the pending development of an online event permitting system as part of the new CAMS IT (Information Technology) Strategy and follows extensive consideration and analysis.

Consideration was given to awaiting the outcomes of the CAMS Organisational Review being concluded by Ernst & Young, but it was decided that by centralising these processes now, the assessment and analysis on the future organisational requirements would be assisted by knowing exactly what is involved in these activities and will allow CAMS to monitor and assess the issues and feed this into the IT development.

A key component of this project will be to simplify the administration of Event Permits and Vehicle Log Books, including streamlining and standardising event supplementary regulations and existing forms. However the overarching aim of the project will be to reduce the burden on applicants and to make it easier for them to interact with CAMS.

Commencing on 22 October, Rebecca Drummond (Victorian Office), Shawn Graetz (Motor Sport Department) and James Madder (Member Services Department) will vacate their current positions and form the Project Team to undertake this important activity. From 7 November the team will visit CAMS State Offices and commence the effective knowledge transfer of these tasks. This process will continue until early December when the phased centralisation of the administration will start to occur.

CAMS recognises that this is a significant task and acknowledges that modifications, refinements and improvements will need to be made along the way as we progressively strive to achieve a best practice model. This is a clear demonstration that CAMS is listening to its stakeholders and striving to improve the way it does business, consistent with its new strategic direction.
