



CQP Kalpowar Invitational Rally May 10th, 2008

As both the Rocky and Kirknie Rallies have been cancelled this year, we got a bit excited about going down to Kalpowar to race in the Central Queensland Club's rally in the Kalpowar Forrest.

We headed off on Thursday afternoon and stopped for the night at Carmilla. We finished the drive down to Calliope and up into the forest park on Friday. What a top spot to have a rally and camping in the forest, camping area was excellent. We were greeted, on our arrival, by some of the organisers of the rally, Anthony and Vicki – what a nice friendly bunch of people, considering we didn't know anyone. But it goes to show that all the articles I have written, about events and people, actually get read – Anthony knew who I was!

The rally was organised so that we could do reconnaissance over the whole route on Saturday morning then start racing before lunch. Believe me, I do still get quite nervous prior to starting and yes I did get teased about that too!

Our rally adventure was quite short lived. We had a major off at the end of SS1 and took the scenic route down the steep bank. The corner went right and we went over the edge, rolled twice and landed on our wheels. The poor mighty Escort is a bit worse of wear and definitely needs major work. The rescuer/recovery crew was excellent and handled the incident really professionally. There was a possibility that Lance had major neck injuries, so the whole spinal injury procedure was put into the program. The guys were fantastic. When we rolled, the first point of impact was the drivers side roof, so Lance's helmet too a big hit when the roof squashed down. Then we rolled again and the same thing happened again. We were a bit concerned about his neck – he does wear a collar when he races and this probably helped. Luckily I was okay, only bruised and battered. The hospital staff and ambulance crew were excellent as were the Care Flight helicopter guys who flew him to Bundaberg for CT scans/X-rays. I would really like to thank everyone involved, from the rally organisers to FIV guys, ambulance crew, hospital staff and helicopter crew.

Peter and a couple of other guys spent a fair bit of time winching our car up the drop off and then Peter drove it back to rally HQ and put it on the truck. The next day I drove to Bundaberg and picked Lance up complete with neck collar and drove back to Townsville. Peter drove our truck and caravan back on Sunday night.

Further x-rays showed that Lance had 2 compressed vertebrae in his Thoracic spine, but we are okay. The Escort looks a bit sad though!

We have learnt from the little experience. Next time, I will practice riding in a tumble dryer before we go racing! Seriously though, thank goodness for roll cages, 3 inch harnesses and new helmets. They all saved our lives. So, all you guys who have read this and have rally cars, please have a look and make sure you have the best safety gear you can manage!

We will be out of action for a while, rebuilding the lean, mean racing machine – but we will be back!
