The event will be held under the International Sporting Code of the FIA, the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd. (CAMS), the National Motorkhana Code, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations that may be issued.

The event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found at www.cams.com.au

Insurance for this event will be provided in accordance with Appendix I of the current CAMS Manual.

CAMS Permit Number: tba

Event type: multi Club Khanacross.

Location: Tonker Park, Lascelles Drive, Whitsundays.

Entries open: 01 May 2010

Close: 01 may 2010

The maximum number of entries which will be accepted is 40. If entries are in excess of this number, they will be selected in order of receipt. Event Organisers reserve the right to refuse entry in accordance with NCR 83 of the current CAMS Manual.

General:

1. Drivers must be members of a CAMS affiliated club and hold a L2NS licence as a minimum.
2. Documents to be presented at Scrutiny include a CAMS Licence, current Club Membership Card, Competition Record (if issued) and CAMS Vehicle Log Book (if issued).
3. Competing vehicles do not need to be registered but will be inspected for safety prior to competing.
4. Drivers and passengers are required to wear covered shoes, short-sleeved shirt and shorts whilst competing. Thongs, sandals and high-heels are not permitted. Helmets must Be worn. Competing vehicles must have at least a lap-type seat belt fitted for each occupant, and must be worn whilst competing.
5. Refuelling must be carried out in the designated refuelling bay. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.
6. No part of the driver or passenger may protrude from the vehicle whilst competing. Offenders will be given a 5 second penalty.
7. Anyone wishing to be a passenger in a competing vehicle must be over 16 years of age, and have parental approval if under 18. They must also sign the "Passenger in vehicle" disclaimer form.

8. During any competition, consumption of alcoholic beverages in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition venue under the control of the officials is expressly forbidden until all practice or competition activity is concluded for each day. Any driver or crew member who is found to be affected by alcohol on the day of the event or practice therefore shall not be permitted to participate. Refer NCR 145A. In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Procedure for Alcohol Testing and CAMS Drugs in Sport Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be tested for alcohol or other drugs at any time during the event(s). This regulation serves as the required 24-hour notice to Competitors, Crew and Officials.
9. Protests must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the current CAMS Manual.
10. The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry or abandon, postpone or cancel the event in accordance with NCR 59.
11. Standard Motorkhana penalties for wrong direction, hit marker, etc will apply.
12. Misc. comments and special conditions wrt passengers in vehicles as stipulated on the Organising Permit apply to this event.
13. Presentations will be made on completion of racing. Trophies for 1st, 2nd and 3rd outright, first lady and first junior will be presented. Other awards may be made at the directors' discretion.
14. In order to ensure that the reputation of motorsport in general and the Whitsunday Sporting Car Club in particular is held in good regard by the viewing public, excessive burnouts or other acts deemed as hooning will lead to immediate exclusion from the event. Hooning outside the venue will be reported to the police.
15. Vehicles will need to be fitted with working Forward Facing headlights and a minimum of one rearward facing Red Tail light.

SFI withdraws Impact Racing certification



CAMS has been made aware that certain products which have previously been certified to be in compliance with the SFI Specification Programs 3.2A, 3.3, 16.1, and 16.5 which have been manufactured and/or distributed by Impact Racing have been decertified by the SFI Foundation Inc, with the decision to take effect on 27th April 2010.

The SFI Foundation Inc is a USA based not for profit organisation established "to issue and administer standards for specialty/performance automotive and racing equipment" (quoted from SFI's web site).

CAMS recognises a number of SFI standards for use in competition, including some in respect to apparel and harnesses which would be subject of the SFI decision. Due to the SFI's decertification of the Impact Racing products outlined above, from 27th April 2010 they can no longer be deemed to be in compliance with the relevant SFI standards and therefore will no longer be able to be used where CAMS specify the relevant SFI standard. However, if the product is also certified to another CAMS-accepted standard then it may continue to be used.

We appreciate this will be of concern to a number of competitors. If you own such a product, CAMS advises that you either refer to the distributor you obtained the product from or manufacturer of the product for further advice.
