- Brisbane: all about rallying, were given a book of competitor feedback. At the meeting there was Central, Us, Brisbane, Northern District, Ipswich and Rally Panel. The main comments for events are keep it simple, cheap, over in a day, bbq, drink and home.
 - QRC next year proposed 4 rounds: two Brisbane, one Rocky, one Townsville. Rally Panel to review the meeting next Monday night and if it's yes then we need to apply to run a round. If we get it, the rally will be run in Ingham as logging in Cardwell will take place next year and we'll lose a stage. The rally will need a min of 150km. Rally Headquarters at Ingham showgrounds, with start, finish and service in forest.
 - One condition of QRC is cannot drop a round. Get bonus points for starting the rally. If we run it will definitely need more officials. Each start needs 3 or 4, to book in and countdown clock, two at flying finish and stop. Barry Nuendorf from Brisbane s has offered to direct the event and Peter Marcovich to be Course Checker.
 - Proposed targeted scrutineering to be done next year. Date of rally at this point is May Day long weekend. If too wet for Ingham, Kirknee is the second option. Seconded, Passed.
- At present you pay to register for QRC and this point next year you won't need to. Locals can compete in these events. Rally will still run if the QRC guys come or not.
