SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

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1. The Event

The Event will be known as the 'Go For Gold Rallysprint' and will be a S2 Multi-Club Rallysprint. The Event will be held on private property at the Millchester Motorsport Facility, (245 Mafeking Road) Charters Towers.

The Event will be held under the FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules (NCRs) of CAMS, the National Rally Codes, the Rallysprint Standing Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations that may be issued.

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au.

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.

CAMS Permit Number is 418/2207/03.

4. Entries

4.1 Acceptance of Entries

- Entries open on publication of these Regulations, and close 1700hrs Wednesday 11th July 2018.
- A maximum of 30 Entries will be accepted. The Clerk of the Course, in his sole discretion, may accept entries in excess of this.
- Entries will NOT be accepted on the day of the Event.
- Entries for competing crews will be accepted in order of receipt and the Entry Form must be completed in its entirety and payment received in full.
- The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry in accordance with NCR 83 and to cancel the meeting if, in its opinion, insufficient entries are received.
- The Organisers reserve the right to cancel, postpone or abandon the Event in accordance with NCR 59.

4.2 Entry and Payment

- Entries must be completed in full on the official Entry Form for the Event. Entry forms can be found online at www.tcac.com.au or by contacting the Event Secretary.
- All Entry Forms must be forwarded to the Event secretary, by email only. Email address: townsvillecityautosportsclub@outlook.com
- Any vehicle which is registered at the time of the Event must provide a CTP Insurance competition extension.
- The Disclaimer Form is to be signed by the Competitor, Driver, Co-Driver(s) and Service Crew at Documentation.

6. Crew Eligibility

- Crews shall consist of ONE or TWO members. One designated as the Driver and One as the Co-Driver. Crews shall remain in these positions for the entirety of the Event for each entry unless prior approval by the Clerk of the Course is granted.
- Drivers must hold a minimum of a CAMS Clubman Rally License. Co-Drivers must hold a minimum of a CAMS Clubman Rally Navigator Licence.
- Crews must wear at minimum the apparel in accordance with the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport Schedule D for a Rallysprint Event.
 - Note: Although always recommended, Frontal Head Restraints and driving suits are NOT mandatory at this Event.
- Co-Drivers are not compulsory, although strongly recommended.

7. Vehicle Eligibility

- All Vehicles must:
 - Comply with the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport Rallysprint Standing Regulations.
 - Be fitted with a minimum Type 3 (6-point) safety cage as set out in Schedule J of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.
 - The vehicle does NOT have to be registered. However, if the vehicle is registered, valid CTP Insurance coverage must be presented at Scrutineering or Documentation.
 - As per the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport a vehicle is not required to have a logbook.
- Tyres of a UTV/ATV style and design are strictly prohibited.

8. Documentation

- Competitors must present at Documentation:
 - Current CAMS competition licence/s (types as per Crew Eligibility Section).
 - Current CAMS affiliated club membership card.
 - CAMS Vehicle Log Book (If the vehicle has one).
 - Proof of valid registration and associated CTP Insurance Cover (If the vehicle is registered).
 - Completed Scrutineering Form from a Regional Scrutineer (if applicable).
- All Competitors must ensure the Disclaimer is signed at Documentation.
- Distribution of service instructions, door numbers, signage and decals etc. will be done once Competitors have fully passed Scrutiny and all Documentation on Saturday 21st July 2018 as per the schedule.

9. Scrutineering

- All vehicles must be scrutineered before competing in the Event. Regional Scrutineering is available with approval from the Chief Scrutineer.
- Scrutineering and Documentation Checks will be conducted at Mike Carney Toyota Recon Workshop, 124-154 Duckworth Street Garbutt 4814, (*situated between 4WD Central "Ironman" and Mike Carney Used Vehicles*) between the hours of 1700-2000 on Wednesday 18th July 2018.
- Scrutiny for re-presents will be available on Saturday 21st July 2018 from 0930-1000hrs.

- Any vehicle deemed to have sustained damage during competition on Saturday 21st July 2018 may be required, at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer, to re-present their vehicle on Sunday 22nd July 2018 from 0730-0800hrs.
- Any vehicle that fails to be assessed at Scrutineering to have “No Apparent Faults Found” will not be allowed to commence competition.
- It is the responsibility of each crew to ensure all Event signage and advertising is pre-fixed to the competition vehicle prior to place the vehicle in the Pre-Event Staging Area.

10. Running Order

- The starting order of competitors will be determined by the Clerk of the Course.
- Starting intervals shall be two (2) minutes. Any alteration to the starting interval will be at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course.
- Competitors will be notified by a Pit Marshall of their required time to present at the start control immediately following any Service Park.
- It is the Competitors responsibility to notify the Pit Marshall if they are unable to make the start of the next stage at the notified time.

11. Reconnaissance

- Reconnaissance is MANDATORY for all competing crew. There will be a minimum of 1 pass and a maximum of 3 passes over each stage for all competing crews. Any crew found to have not conducted a reconnaissance pass over each stage or having conducted more than 3 passes will be excluded from the Event.
- Day 1 Stages will be open for recce on Saturday 21st July 2018 as per the schedule.
- Day 2 Stages will be open for recce on Sunday 22nd July 2018 as per the schedule.
- Reconnaissance will be conducted after Documentation and Briefings. All crew must have completed all Documentation, Scrutineering and have attended all relevant Briefings to be eligible to conduct reconnaissance.
- A speed limit of 40km/h applies to all vehicles conducting reconnaissance.
- The stages will not be considered closed during reconnaissance. There may be officials present on the stages as well as other crews/vehicles conducting reconnaissance in all directions of travel according to the stage layouts (forward and reverse directions).
- All Crew are advised to keep left and do not cut corners during reconnaissance.

12. Running Details

- There will be 3 competitive stages. 2 will be run on Saturday 21st July 2018 and 1 on Sunday 22nd July 2018.
- There is a total competitive distance of approx. 65.4km.
- The 2 Saturday stages are each approx. 2.7km. The 1 Sunday Stage is approx. 5.5km long.
- Each stage will be run 6 times. 3 times in each forward and reverse direction.
- Section start and finish points are marked by rally Special Stage Signage.
- Due to the timing of the Event several stages may be run at night and therefore it is strongly recommended that all Crews bring additional lighting.

13. Servicing and Refuelling

- There will be a centralised Service Park located at the Townsville City Autosports Club grounds at the Millchester Motor Sport Facility (245 Mafeking Rd, Charters Towers).
- A Service Park layout will be provided to all Crew and Officials prior to the Event.
- Refuelling is only permitted in the Service Park, within the designated Refuel Area. The organisers require any personnel who are involved in the refuelling of vehicles wear neck to wrist to ankle fire resistant clothing (cotton pants and long sleeved shirt are acceptable).
- There must be a minimum of 2 personnel to carry out refuelling, 1 of which is to be prepared to operate the provided fire extinguisher at all times during refuelling.

14. Results

- Timing will be to the whole second.
- The winner of each competition within the Event shall be the Competitor who achieves the lowest aggregate elapsed time. The aggregate elapsed time shall be calculated by adding together the results for each crew from each stage of the Event, with the exception of each Crew's worst result on each stage.
 - A "worst result" may include where a Competitor elects not to, or fails to, complete a run of the stage

15. Protests

- Protests must be lodged in accordance with the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport.

16. Awards

- The following awards will be made to Crews in accordance with results as per section 14 of the Supplementary Regulations :
 - Event Outright – 1st, 2nd & 3rd Outright Driver and Co-Driver (where applicable).
- In the Event of a tie, Competitor's will share equally in any awards.
- The Organisers reserve the right to add additional awards.

17. Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

- Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty (ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website.
Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day. Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

 - others participants acting dangerously or with lack of skills;
 - high levels of noise exposure;
 - acts of violence and other harmful acts (whether intentional or inadvertent) committed by persons attending or participating in the event; and
 - the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY, RELEASE & INDEMNITY

In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motor Sport Activities, I **agree**:

- to **release** CAMS and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
 - a) my **death**;
 - b) any **physical or mental injury** (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);

 - ii. that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community, howsoever arising from my participation in or attendance at the Motor Sport Activities;
- to **indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified** the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motor Sport Activities **at my own risk**.

I **understand** that:

- nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of the Entities as the supplier of the Motor Sport Activities / Recreational Services;
- nothing in this document prevents the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability;
- nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded; however the liability of the Entities is limited to the minimum liability allowable by law;
