The Australian Rally Championship has announced a six round calendar for the 2019 season, beginning in April.

Events-wise, the calendar is identical to this year. The order, however, has changed.

Victoria's round of the championship, the Eureka Rally, will be moved from March to August in what will give competitors and organisers a new look at the Ballarat roads.

In the previous two years, the roads have been dry and dusty, but an August event will ensure the dust is minimal and will throw up different conditions on the fast and flowing roads.

The Forest Rally in Western Australia has taken over as the championship's opener, from April 5 to 7.

It is the first time that WA has hosted the first round of the championship since 2016.

Canberra's classically tough roads make up round two in the second weekend in May, with Tasmania keeping their winter slot, moving a month earlier to June 19-21.

This year, Tasmania gave the ARC a great reception when thousands of people attended the Friday evening super special stage in central Launceston. It was the first time that the Apple Isle had hosted a round for almost 10 years.

The Adelaide Hills Rally will be round five of the championship, followed by the regular season-ending trip to Coffs Harbour for Rally Australia.

CAMS General Manager of Motor Sport Michael Smith said he was looking forward to another action packed season.

"The depth of talent in the ARC is very promising and the fierce competition at the pointy end of the field has produced some amazing performances in 2018. We look forward to seeing more of that next year," Smith said.

"I'm also really excited to confirm we have some more changes planned for the Championship's structure, which we look forward to announcing around Rally Australia later this year."

Eli Evans leads the 2018 ARC title race ahead of Rally Australia in two weeks, ahead of Harry Bates and Steve Glenney.

Rally Australia has retained is place as the **World Rally Championship** season finale with the announcement of the 2019 calendar.

WRC organisers have released their expanded 14 round 2019 schedule overnight with Chile to make its debut on the program, the 32nd country to host the WRC since it was launched in 1973.

Chile will add another gravel rally to the schedule with the event to be based out of the countries second biggest city, Concepción, and be run as a double-header with Rally Argentina.

WRC Promoter managing director Oliver Ciesla welcomed Chile to the championship, its promotion following the return of Turkey to the 2018 series after an eight-year absence.

"We pursue a strategy to further globalise the championship by incorporating more events outside Europe." said Ciesla.

"Turkey successfully brought a WRC footprint back to the Asian continent and Chile will prove an equally worthy addition to the 2019 calendar."

With an eye to the future, candidate events are scheduled for both Japan and Kenya to gauge the readiness of both countries for a slot in the WRC calendar.

"This year's candidate rally in Chile achieved a very high level. The colour, passion and intensity of back-to-back rallies in Latin America, a region whose booming motorsport imprint provides great potential to further increase fan interest, will generate further impetus to the WRC." added Ciesla.

"We're currently experiencing a surging demand from countries worldwide to join the WRC, which is a clear indication of its increasing popularity. We want to continue to develop the series over the next years and explore important new markets."

As is traditional, the 2019 championship will commence on the ice-covered Alpine roads of Rallye Monte-Carlo on January 24-27 and then conclude on the gravel roads of Coffs Harbour for the final round in Australia November 14-17.
